REPORT OF COMMITTEES:

Community Protection - Woomert stated Princeton will receive approximately \$71,000 from Fire District 1 for the upcoming fiscal year. Princeton Fire Dept. recently recognized Roger Woomert as an honorary member.

Streets – Woomert gave special thanks to Public Works for keeping the streets clean and all their hard work.

Community Visioning - Wolfe thanked Community Visioning volunteers for attending meetings and website training. Wolfe stated that while similar to the trail and park project, Visioning is separate and focused on improving all transportation and accessibility throughout Princeton. Visioning will host seven virtual focus groups with target audiences to gain participation from citizens on 03/30/2021 and 04/1/2021. Visioning is working on materials and a website to keep residents informed.

Trails –McDonough announced the Dog Scamper walk and run fundraiser is 3/26/2021.

Partners of Scott County Watersheds would like to schedule a 2021 Whiskey Run Creek Cleanup. Council discussed a tentative date of 07/10/2021.

McDonough will forward information for Council and Planning and Zoning to provide input on the Princeton map to Bi-State Regional Commission prior to 03/1/2021.

BUDGET HEARING:

Mayor Kernan and Council discussed the preliminary budget in depth. Council discussed with Clerk Tweed on getting the final revenue numbers and how to work the water tower maintenance project into all future budgets. Clerk Tweed will complete the budget entries on 02/13/2021 and publish the Max Levy Notice on 02/17/2021 with a Max Levy Hearing set for 03/01/2021 and a final Budget published on 02/24/2021 with a Budget Hearing set for 03/11/2021.
