Notification will be posted on the website and the LED sign outside the Community Center.

Important Information

Street Parking: No vehicle on any street in the city shall remain parked for more than 24 hours in any one location when it interferes with snow removal.

Parking areas will be provided by the city and marked as such. They may be used if two (2) inches or more of snow is predicted. They must be removed within 48 hours after the event or if an emergency is does not occur.
